This week we have learning all about fractions and how to find a fraction of a number.

Top tips-

1. Look at the denominator (bottom number) for how many equal groups you are sharing the number into.
2. Look at the numerator (top number) for how many of those groups you want.

Example:

$$\frac{1}{2} \text{ of } 6 = 3 \text{ (I only want 1 group so the answer is 3)}$$

2. $\frac{1}{3}$ of 9 =

3. $\frac{1}{4}$ of 16

4. $\frac{1}{4}$ of 20 =
