

## Sports Premium Strategy 2023 -2024

Headlines of Impact from Sports Premium funding at Parklands primary school in 2022-2023:

- Increased number of children leaving Year 6 able to swim and have knowledge of water safety (increase of 22% from previous year)
- Took part in all Trust competitions on offer across the year, as well as Northamptonshire sport cross country competitions
- Competitions engaged had increased along with success in first places achieved in Trust competitions, tripled success rates since previous year
- KS 2 engagement has increased greatly in clubs and competitions, including the number of pupil premium children taking part in extra curricula clubs (see attached engagement below)
- Successful staff training led to PE observation showing high quality teaching of PE, with strong subject knowledge from staff
- Exposure to wider sporting experiences for year groups was very popular and strong engagement, particularly with KS 2 quidditch
- All children in Years 3 – 6 took part in Mini Wimbledon during the summer term with strong pupil voice about this experience
